Year 3

This week Year 3 have been introduced to the amazing Natural disaster- Earthquakes. We have learnt about where earthquakes occur, how they impact on people's lives and how strong they are (magnitude). We have also had great fun using 'oreos' to demonstrate the movement of tectonic plates.

Did you know? *The largest recorded earthquake in the world was a magnitude 9.5 and occurred in Chile on May 22, 1960.*

In Literacy we have written a descriptive piece about Mount Vesuvius learning how to edit and improve work and in Maths we have continued to explore formal and informal methods of addition and subtraction involving exchange @WBJyear3

Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been mastering our mental subtraction and focusing on column subtraction. We have been looking at how to find missing digits and how to exchange from different columns. In Literacy, we explored different newspaper articles, found the features of a newspaper whilst researching all about Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankahmun's tomb. In Topic, we have created presentations using Google Slides, displaying all of our knowledge about the Ancient Egyptians including famous pharaohs, the mummification process and beloved Egyptian Gods @WBJyear4

Year 5

This week in year 5 we have been looking at adult job roles during the Victorian times. We focused on differing areas of employment, skilled and unskilled workers and we wrote a comparison of which job we thought was the best and which job we thought was the worst. As part of home learning this week we are looking at the workhouse in more depth.
