We have a Drop in session in the school hall on Friday 8th November between 9 and 10 am. This is for parents to discuss any concerns / get advice. Our Senco and Lead Pastoral lady will also be available during the session.

### We are Readers

Now that we are half way through the new term we should now have established a good reading routine. Each week we publish our reading totals on the newsletter. Our expectations at WBJs is that all children read for a MINIMUM of three times a week - this is all we expect as our home learning. A reading letter was sent home at the end of the second week explaining that if our children only read during the time they are in school this would only equate to 117 reads over the course of a year. This is not enough to get our children reading fluently and developing their comprehension of what they are reading. Our totals are now displayed in the hall as well. We provide children with book bags for children to be able to carry their records and books to and from school - it is a great habit to get into bringing it in daily that way if there's an unexpected absence the records will have already been checked and recorded as the child having read. Next week we are starting a new initiative in year 3 and each class will have the opportunity to bring home a story-book box. This will be shown on next week's newsletter. There will also be a parent drop in to discuss anything reading on 16th October at 1:30pm in the school hall.

Please note our policy is that only stud earrings are to be worn in school. We do ask that on PE days they are not worn to school, unless your child is able to remove them without assistance or send them with plasters so they can cover their own ears.

WBJs will be entering a Cross Country competition on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> October at Cleethorpes Leisure Centre, £5 per person call in to the office to collect a form if your child is interested in taking part.

## Online Safety

Who would you talk to if you felt unsafe online?

Research shows only 55% of young people sought help from a parent after a negative online experience. Your child may not tell you about a negative incident if they think they will be punished or have their device taken away.

You can encourage your child to talk to you about an online issue by discussing:

- that you will be there to help protect and support them, no matter what
- your reaction – reassure them you will stay calm
- the actions you might take to support and help them feel safer

You can also try talking through an online safety scenario with your child, sharing your feelings and the challenges of talking about this type of experience.
